ASSISTANT PROFESSOR, COUNSELING PSYCHOLOGY**

The Department of Counseling, Rehabilitation Counseling, and Counseling Psychology invites applications for an academic year, tenure line, benefits-eligible faculty position at the rank of Assistant Professor to begin August 16, 2016. The appointee will serve as a core faculty member of the APA-accredited Counseling Psychology Ph.D. program. Salary is commensurate with qualifications and experience. Responsibilities include teaching, research, and service.

The department is located within the College of Education and Human Services. It hosts three nationally accredited programs: the counseling program is accredited by CACREP, the rehabilitation counseling program is accredited by CORE, and the counseling psychology program is accredited by APA, with a proposed military psychology area of emphasis.

WVU is the state's major research university and is classified as a Carnegie Foundation Research University (High Research Activity). WVU offers 191 degree programs at the bachelor, master, doctoral, and professional level of study through 14 colleges and schools. Funding from externally sponsored programs currently exceeds \$140 million annually. Enrollment is approximately 30,000 students.

WVU is located in Morgantown, WV, a vibrant university town that enjoys a reasonable cost of living, world-class healthcare, a strong commitment to education, exciting recreation and art facilities, and a strong business community. Morgantown has been ranked more than once as one of the top three small cities in the East (<http://www.morgantownwv.gov>) and was named by the National Trust for Historic Preservation to its 2007 list of America's Dozen Distinctive Destinations. Major cities are within driving distance: Pittsburgh is approximately 1.25 hours away, and Cleveland, Columbus, and Washington, DC are no more than 3.5 hours from Morgantown.

Required Qualifications: The successful candidate will hold a doctorate in Counseling Psychology, be licensed, and show evidence of professional experience as a military psychologist or work with veterans and their families. The candidate must have experience in teaching, research, and service commensurate with the qualifications of the tenure line Assistant Professor at West Virginia University. Please provide evidence of scholarly activity that relates to military/veteran populations.

Responsibilities: The successful candidate will contribute to the core teaching, research, and service within the APA-approved Ph.D. program in Counseling Psychology. Specifically, the candidate will contribute to the development and teaching of courses within the proposed Military Psychology area of emphasis and other relevant courses within the doctoral program.

Application Process: Screening of application materials will begin immediately, but applications will continue to be accepted until the position is filled.
